

## St Werburgh's CE Primary School Local Offer Statement

St Werburgh's CE Primary School is a mainstream school which takes pupils from 4-11. We currently have 316 pupils on role.

We are set in the outskirts of Spondon village in Derby. Our main access is off the street. We have extensive outside areas and a large playing field which is used for sporting and leisure activities. We do not have parking facilities for parents.

We have 10 classrooms in total plus a school hall which is used for lunchtimes, PE and daily worship. We also have a communal learning hub and a group room which is the home for our before and after school club. One classroom in Key Stage 2 is accessible by stairs from inside school but does have ramped access from the outside. The Foundation Stage Unit and all Key Stage 1 classrooms have toilet facilities within the classrooms. We have a disabled toilet which is adjacent to the school hall.

Admissions come through Derby City central admissions arrangements and are based on our school admissions criteria. (See Admissions Policy)

We are an inclusive school and will aim to make any arrangements needed for pupils living in our catchment area to be fully included in our school.

We differentiate teaching and learning tasks to suit the needs of the learner. Risk assessments will be written and shared with parents when they are needed and we can write a personal evacuation plan if that is required. We successfully support pupils with additional needs at St Werburgh's CE Primary School and ensure they are included in extra curricular activities and residential. We work closely with Local Authority Specialist Teachers from STePS when a child has a specific need. We also supported by the Educational Psychology Service when their advice is needed.

Our school motto is **Achieve Believe Together**

Children are identified as having Special Educational Needs if their progress has slowed or stopped and the interventions and resources put in place do not enable improvement. Once this occurs, we have specific target setting plans which help support their development and accelerate progress. At this point the child is listed on an SEND register. Parents will be invited to discuss and review targets and support three times a year with the class teacher.

Our school has two SENCOs. Mrs Dean is Assistant Head and is Key Stage 1 and Foundation Stage Lead. Mrs Feetham works part-time in the Foundation Stage class, and has been awarded the National Senco Award and helps to coordinate support for children with additional needs. All staff are first aid trained and this is renewed every three years.
